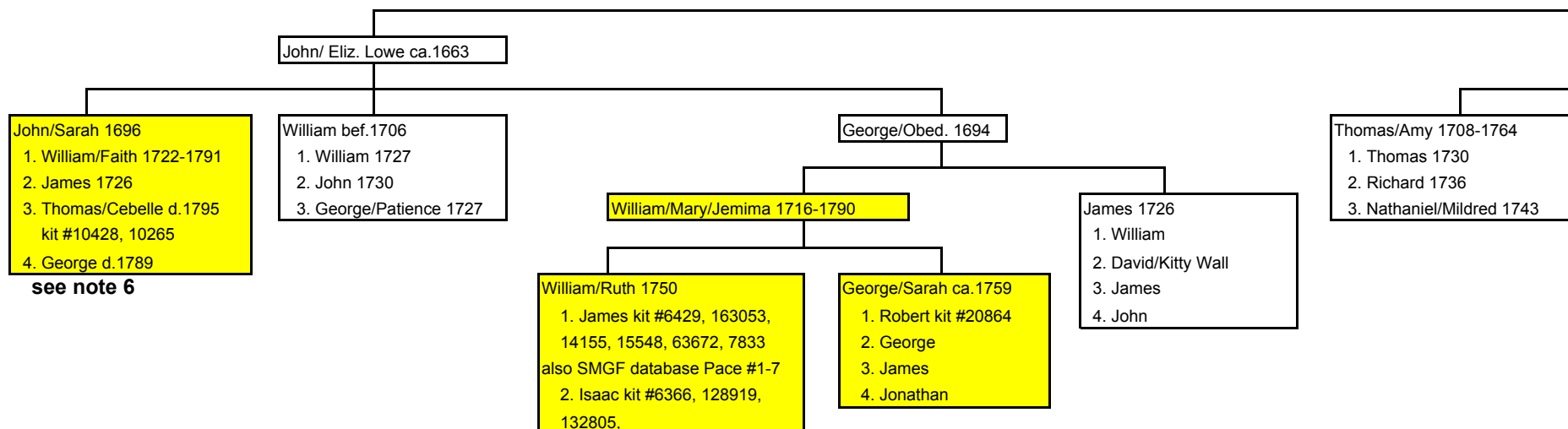


## Group 3 DNA Chart by John Pace Jan. 2010

- notes:
- 1 George/Ann Pill have been placed here and not connected with parents. The lineage provided by the donor appears to be taken from Bruce Howard's book in which Bruce mistakenly thought George/Ann was the George named in the will of William Pace/Jemima who died 1790.
  - 2 William/Sisley 1747 parents unproven but he could be a son of John/Sarah 1730 and stayed in Nash/Edgecombe when John moved to Surry, NC DNA & naming patterns of Alsey & Dempsey support this. See related note 7.
  - 3 Stephen/Ann/Lucy parents unproven but he could also be a son of John/Sarah and stayed in Nash/Edgecombe when John moved to Surry, NC, DNA & naming patterns of Alsey would support this. See related note 7.
  - 4 William/Sarah Frazier ca 1775 father has also not been identified; however he named a son Dempsey and had a grandson named Richmond. Thomas kit# 137170, was on 1820 Maury Co TN census, possibly closely related to William kit# 7811 who died Maury Co,TN. Thomas was born in NC. I am tentatively placing these two tests together based on location and naming patterns with further research needed.
  - 5 Jesse/Polly 1773 parents are also unproven; however he originated in Surry, NC, named his first son Richmond & was born around the time that John Pace entered land in his son Richmond's name, suggesting Richmond may have a family, so I am tentatively placing him as a son of Richmond based on location & naming patterns. There is no evidence he was a son of Thomas & Keziah Pace as Bruce Howard suggested.
  - 6 Kit # 10428 & 10265 have been placed as descendants of Thomas d.1795 in Halifax, NC because he is the father of Hardy Pace who moved on to Georgia. Court case of 1814 in Edgefield, SC mentions Cebell Matthews who intermarried with Tho. Pace, now deceased, and since with Benj. Carr, resident of the State of Georgia.
  - 7 The father of Francis Pace/Ann ca. 1728 is unproven and it is possible that he could be descended from an unidentified son of James Pace based on the fact that we have two unidentified Paces owning land just south of where Francis got his patent in 1756. One plat is just north of Thomas Burge and the other is just south of him. Francis Pace was a witness in the will of Tho. Burge. The unidentified Pace land south of Tho. Burge was owned by a Pace prior to 1717 and we know Richard & Sarah Woodlief Pace's plantation was in northern Prince George Co. so it is unlikely that it was this Richard. There is a possibility this land could have belonged to John/Elizabeth Lowe however, because it is near where their son George owned land previous to his move to North Carolina. That being said, if Francis was from the line of James and not a son of Richard who married Sarah Woodlief, it would leave open the possibility that some of the 3B donors in blue are descended from Richard and Elizabeth.
